

BE it known that I Timothy Russell Doctor of the state of South Carolina, and County of Abbeville being in Perfect health and sound of Memory, Do will and Bequath unto my well Beloved wife Margaret Russell the whole of my Plantation that I now live on Containing six Hundred and Fifty acres of Land more or less, it is my Desire that if my nephew Abraham Russell behave himself to my Wife Margaret that she she said Margret, Do make to the said Abraham a Lawful Tittle to fifty acres of Land off the said Tract lying on the East side of the Branch on which he now lives, I likewise will and Bequath unto my son Robert Russell son of Martha Russell one Tract of Land Containing one Hundred acres more or less lying in Abbeville County on Corletail Creek of Long Cane likewise one Track of Land lying in Edgefield County Containing Two Hundred Fifty more or less lying on the water of Sleepy Creek, if he comes in his own person to make his Clame, if not the Two above Mentioned Tracts of Land Containing Thre Hundred and fifty acres more or less to be the Real Right of my wife Margrets, as much as if my son Robert had not bin Mentioned in my will Likewise I Do appoint my wife Margret the Whole Executrix of my will to Colect my Debts and to pay all I Owe, and I Do will and Bequeath to my Wife Margret all the Remainder of my Property. Viz, Fore Negroes, Terry, Molley Tenny and Sam, and Household Furnitre, and Stock of all Kinds, and any or Every Thing Else that Can-or may be found of my Property: which I Do Acknowledge to be my last will and Testament unto which I have set my hand and seal this first Day of July in the Eighteenth year of American Independence A.N. One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety Four.
