WILLIAM BROWN

In the Name of god Amen I William Brown gen<sup>r</sup>. of The State of South Carolina Ninety six District Abbeville County Being in a low state of health but perfectly in my Senses do make and ordain this My last Will and Testament . In the first place I recommend my Soul To god who gave it and my Body to be decently Inter'd In a Christianly Manner. It is my Will & desire that My Estate which it has bin pleased god to blesse me with Shall be disposed off in the following manner(Viz) I Lend unto my wife Isabel Brown Induring her life my House and plantation and any part of My <sup>land</sup> adjoining the said Plantation that she may think proper to clear and cultivate also my negro fellow Dick and one fourth of all my stock. Shall my House hould & Ketchen Furnature and after her death my Will and desire is the said negro fellow Dick shall be sold ~~and~~ <sup>as soon as conveniently</sup> to be disposed of in the following manner(Viz) I give unto my grandson John Brown son to Mr. Brown Ten Pounds Sterling. I give unto my grandson David Black son to James Black Five pounds Sterling and the ballance of the money arising from the sale of the said negro to be Equally Divided between my four Daughters Isabel Brown Mary Brown Sarah Brown & Martha Brown. My will and desire is after my Wife's death that all my Household & Kitchen furnature and the stock she was possessed off shall be equally divided between my four Daughters unmarried I give unto my son Wm Brown Two hundred acres of land Part of which he is now living on to Conclude his plantation and to extend to Robert Griffins line to him and his Heirs Forever after giving my three granddaughters Margaret Brown Elizabeth Brown Frances Brown Daughters to my son John Brown Deceased Ten pounds in such Trade as shall suite my son William Brown unto Each of the said granddaughters after my wife's death I give unto my Four Daughters Isabel Brown Mary Brown Sarah Brown & Martha Brown My houses plantation and Two Hundred and Eleven Acres of Land adjoining to be Equally Divided to them and their Heirs for ever. I give Unto my grandson William Ruford a parcel of land fifty acres more or less Adjoining James Black's line Robert Griffin's Line & William Brown Jun<sup>r</sup> Line to him and Abbeville County Wills 1787-1815

five Shillings Sterling Also I give Unto My Son William Brown  
and due me from Hugh Brown one hundred and ten Shill-  
ings Old Currency and if Collected he Shall give Unto my granddaughter  
Beckey Brown forty Shillings Sterling whereas I have left unto  
my Grandson Wm. Ruford a tract or parcel of land if he should  
Die without an issue or before he Comes of Age it is my desire  
That My Daughter Margaret Ruford shall have the said land to her  
A her heirs As Witness my hand and seal this 11th day , May 1781
