WILLIAM COVINGTON

In the Name of God Amen. I William Covington Planter of the county of Abbeville & State of South Carolina being weak in body but of sound Mind & Memory & Knowing that all men must die Do make & ordain my last will & Testament as follows. Viz  
1st. It is my will that all my just Debts be paid out of my Estate according to Law

2<sup>d</sup> I give & bequeath to my Beloved Wife Phebe Covington one fourth Part of my Estate Real & Personal--

3<sup>d</sup> I give to my beloved Daughter Nancy Fuguey one good gown Pattern having already given her her Share of my Estate.

4th I give unto my grand Daughter Harriot Moor Daughter of George B. Moor & Polly ~~his~~ wife one Negro girl named Milley now in the possession of 3<sup>d</sup> George B. Moor -- on condition however that if 3<sup>d</sup> Harriot dies before she comes of Age or before she marries or without legitimate Heirs said Negro girl Milley is to revert to my Estate & be the common Property of my surviving Heirs--

5th All the remainder of my Estate real & Personal I give & bequeath to my three beloved Sons Charles, William & Richard Covington to be equally Divided among them except such Difference as my Executors may think prudent & just to make in favor of William & Richard for the sake of schooling them so as to be on a Footing in this Respect with their Brother Charles

6th. It is my Will that if any of my Heirs die without lawful Issue such decenset's share or shares shall by equal division become the property of my surviving Heir or Heirs --

7th it is my Will & Request that my dear Wife (alias Widow) Phebe William Fuguey Barkley Martin The two latter of Edgefield

County, execute this my Will--- & I hereby revoke & disannul every Will & Power of Attorney by me made or to be made
