In the name of God Amen:

I William Huggins of the state of South Carolina
Abbeville County Planter being very sick and weak in Body but
of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God. Calling
unto mind the mortality of my body do make and ordain this my
lastwill and Testament that is to say principally and first of
all I give and Recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God
that gave it and my Body + Recommend to the Earth to be buried
in a decent Christian like manner at the discretion of my Executors
whoom I shall hereafter appoint nothing doubting but the general
Resurrection I shall Receive the same again by the mighty power
of God and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it has
pleased God to bless me (with) in this life I give, devise and
dispose of the same in the following manner & form that is to say
first of all my will is that all my just debts be paid out of my
personal estate secondly my will is that my well beloved wife
Martha Huggins shall have her third part of my estate both real
and personal during her natural life tThirdly my will is that
my three Children(that is to say) Elisabeth Huggins, William
Andrew Huggins and Mary Huggins shall have the remaining part of
my estate both personal & real to be equally divided between
them share and share alike to them and their heirs forever and
further my will is that at the death of my wife Martha Huggins
her third part of my estate shall go to my three Children to
equally dived between them share & share alike to them and
their heirs forever and lastly I do hereby appoint my dearly be-
loved wife Martha Hugins and James Gouedy to be my true and
lawful executors to this my last will & testament hereby revoking
all former will or wills by me hereto Abbeville County Wills 1787-1815
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twelfth day of

their heirs forever and lastly I do hereby appoint my dearly be-
loved wife Martha Hugins and James Gouedy to be my true and
lawful executors to this my last will & testament hereby revoking
all former will or wills by me hereto fore made-- In witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand seal this twelfth day May
in the year of our Lord one thowsand seven hundred and ninety
nine--
