My will is that my Plantation whereon I now live on the Mul-
berry Creek containing about two hundred and eighty acres of
Land be equally Divided amongst my four Children Samuel Ann
Mary & Hannah according to quantity Quality & Improvement I
give unto my Daughter Peggy Ten pounds to be paid to her by
my executors out of the monies arising from the sale of any
part of my estate which is hereafter mentioned to be sold. I
Give unto my Son John Mulroy Fifty dollars, my will is that it
be paid unto him by my executors out of the monies arising
out of the sale of such part of my estate as is hereafter men-
tioned to be sold. My will is that my executors sell my Waggon
& Ten Head of Grown Cattle- My will is that my Negro boy Bill
be sold and the money arising from the sale of 3 Negro be equal-
ly Divided Between my Daughters Ann Mary & Hannah Mulroy- My
