WILLIAM REIGHLEY

In the Name of God amen, in the year of our Lord 1795, I William Reighley of the State of South Carolina Abbeville County Gentleman, being Very sick and weak in Body; but of perfit mind and Memory thanks be unto god, therefore calling unto Mind the mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, Do make and order this my Last will & Testament that is to say principally & first of all I give and Recommend my soul unto the hands of God that give it, and for my Body, I Recommend it to the Earth to be buried in a Christian and Deasent like maner at the Discretion of my Executors Nothing Doughing but at the general Resurrection I shall Receive the same again, by the Mighty power of God. and as touching such worldly Estate who with it hath pleased God to Bless me with in this life, I give & Dispose of the same in the following form & maner, I will and order all Debts and Demands to be paid first that is Just,

2 I give and Bequeath To Elizabeth my well beloved Wife the plantation where she now lives to her use ~~and her heirs forever~~ and by her to be left to her naturel Ishue, as she may will it; Together with the use of the personal property for schooling and Raising the Children then to be Disposed off at publick sail ~~and~~ Together with two plantations and an Eaqueal Devide mad between the mother and four Children And For William my well beloved son I give and bequeath to him a Traet of Land lying and being in the County of Penalton S^c Carolina, in the forke of Saluda and the Olonoisie together with his eaquel part of all the other property when sold--the sail not to be till my son William is of age unless my widow marries another man In which Case I will a sail of all the property to be maid and her to heave her Devid-- it being my hole Diser to heave it so Devided ~~between my wife~~
