Also the remainder of my Estate which is not already Willed I leave to be equally divided among all my hildred as they come of age----

Lastly I Constitute and appoint my friends Joseph Matthis

James Buchanan & My Son James Wedgworth my only I Sole Executors

of this my last will and Testament and I do hereby utterly

disallow, Revoke and disannal all and every other former

Testaments wills, and reacties, Bequests & Executors by me in any ways before this time named, willed and bequeathed attifying & Confirming This and no other to be my last will and Testament In witness wheranf I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the day & year xxxx above written----
