Item third. At the death of my wife, I give and bequeath to my two daughters, Pennelope and Agnes, and to them in trust one third thereof, for the benefit of their sister Mary Williams, a certain part of the land on which I live including the dwelling house and all the buildings with the spring. Beginning at the first hollow below where a branch emties into the creek and up the hollow until it intersects with another hollow and up said hollow a due south course to the top of the ridge and the same course to the branch and then down the branch until it comes to the spring branch and then a due North course to the creek and the creek and the creek to the beginning

Item fourth. At the death of my wife I give and bequeath to my son Stepen Guttry one hundred acres of land to be laid out for him as follows. Beginning at the mouth of a branch where it emties into the creek below Eurpheys line and running up said

belongs to the children that live with me, not included. And the proceeds of said sale to be disposed of as follows. Item Sixth. To obadiah Duckworth and wife one dollar each. To William K. Williams and wife, one dollar each. And to my son Henry Guttry fifty dollars. And to my son William Guttry thirty dollars. And all the balance of the proceeds of the sale of the whole of my property to be equally divided among my five daughters viz. Temperence Elrod, Milley Elrod, Pennelope Guttry Agnes Guttry and Sarah Flemming one equal part to Temperence and her \* husband Philip Elred the principle to be kept by them and divided among the children of Temperence as they come to the age of , twenty one years. The interest to be used by them in raising and schooling the children. And one equal part to be paid to Samuel & Milly Elrod. And one equal part to be paid to William & Sarah Flemming. And three equal parts to be paid to Pennelope & Cuttry, one third in trust for the use of Mary Williams. And I do hereby appoint constitute and ordain my two sons Nelson & Benjamin Guttry executors of this my last will and testament disallowing all others confirming this and no other to be my las will and Testament.
