And as to what worldly Goods it hath been please God to bestow upon me, it is my will, and I do positively order. that they be disposed off in the following manner

First. that all my Lawful debts be paid

2<sup>d</sup> I bequeath to my beloved wife Susanah, my whole estate of Land whereon I now live, Containing ~~two hundred~~ and sixty three Acres, and all my Stock of every discripeion during her natural life, and at her desease to be disposed off as follows.

1<sup>st</sup> I bequeath ~~to my son Thomas one~~ bed and furniture and one Cow and calf

2<sup>nd</sup> I bequeath to my Daughter Nancy one bed and furniture

3<sup>d</sup> I bequeath to my son William one hundred Acres of Land it being part of the above tract of two hundred and sixty three Acres and all the Stock that may remain in the pofsefsion of or my wife may be intitlled to at her death and one bed and furniture with all the hous furniture and to mantain Nancy as long as She will live with him

5<sup>th</sup> I bequeath to my Sons Thomas and Garland the balance of the above Tract of Land being one hundred and sixty three acres to be equally divided between them

Lastly, I do hereby nominate and appoint My Sons William and Thomas to be my Executors to this my Last will and testament revoking all former wills by me made. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 24<sup>th</sup> November 1829--
