I Hugh Poor of South Carolina Anderson District being of sound and disposing mind and memory, but weak in body, and calling to mind the uncertainty of life, and being desirous to dispose of all such worldy estate as it hath pleased God to blefs me with, do make and ordain this my last Will in manner following, that is to say: I desire immediately after my decease that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid, And after payment of my just debts & funeral expenses I give to my wife Anna Poor all of my estate as well real as personal during the term of her natural life or widowhood and after her decease I give the same to my children (viz) Andrew J $_{\P}$ Poor, George W Poor, John J Poor, Hugh Poor, Samuel E Poor, Sarah V Poor and Mary E Poor to be equally divided amongst them, to them and their heirs forever. And if in case my wife Anna Poor should marry I (Hugh Poor) then authors my executors to bring the same into sale and divide the proceeds thereof equally amongst my children giving my wife Anna Poor and equal share with them

Also any monies or property that may hereafter fall or descend to me or my children by heirship in and through my Father John Poor's estate I also authorise my executors to settle such monies or property upon my wife Anna Poor and my children in the manner as set forth above, and as it respects the portion that may hereafter fall to my children of my estate I wish my executors to keep the same at interest untill they arrive at full age or what is termed free by law and then to settle and ive them their respective shares then and not before

And lastly I do constitute and appoint my beloved brother John

Will in manner following, that is to say: Arderson County Will Book B 1835-184 after my decease that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid, And after payment of my just debts & funeral expenses I give to my wife Anna Poor all of my estate as well real as personal during the term of her natural life or widowhood and after her decease I give the same to my children (viz) Andrew J. Poor, George W Poor, John J Poor, Hugh Poor, Samuel E Poor, Sarah V Poor and Mary E Poor to be equally divided amongst them, to them and their heirs forever. And if in case my wife Anna Poor should marry I (Hugh Poor) them sixt: is a my executors to bring the same into sale and divide the proceeds thereof equally amongst my children giving my wife Anna Poor and equal share with them

Also any monies or property that may hereafter fall or descend to me or my children by heirship in and through my Father John Poor's estate I also authorise my executors to settle such monies or property upon my wife Anna Poor and my children in the manner as set forth above, and as it respects the portion that may hereafter fall to my children of my estate I wish my executors to keep the same at interest untill they arrive at full age or what is termed free by law and then to settle and give them their respective shares then and not before And lastly I do constitute and appoint my beloved brother John Poor and brotherinlaw William Holland executors of this my will testament by me heretofore made.
