First- I desire that my just debts be paid by My Executor out of the property hereafter Set apart for that purpose Second- I give and bequeath to my wife Susanna Burrefs during her natural life a Negro Woman Rachel--Two Cows & calves-Two Ewes and Lambs Three Beds and furniture and one Loom- I also desire that my wife shall continue to live on the plantation on which I now live to be supported at the charge of my son James upon which exprefs condition it is that the following bequest of Said plantation is made to him it being also understood and expected that his mother will so dispose the services of the Girl Rachel as will aid and afsist in providing her maintenance after the death of my wife I desire that the property above bequeathed to her during life shall be sold by my Executor on such terms as he shall deem adviseable the proceeds to be distributed as directed unlefs the parties in interest can agree amongst themselves for which purpose my said Excutor is authorised to represent all such as are under age hereby declaring and directing that overy such act done by my Said xecutor Shall be binding on such minors and fully adequate to the acceptance or relinquishment of a complete title --I also give to my wife one bay horse in fee simple

Third- I give and bequeath to my Son James Eurrefs in fee Simple forever the tract of Land whereon I now reside charged however as before declared with the Support of his Mother- also one

out of the foregoing property willed to my Son James I desire my Executor to pay my debts including a debt owed to Bryan Burrefs for his services amounting to thirty Five Dollars thirty nine cents and also a reasonable complensation to my son Jacob for his Services herein and I hereby constitute and appoint Jacob Burrefs Guardian for my Son James during his monority with full power to act for him in every possible contingency that may arise his Guardian to permit said James to enter at once upon the enjoyment of his Estate subject to Such Controul as the said Jacob Burrefs may on the power and discreet my said James in no instance to have the power to sell exchange or dispose of any of his property without the express consent and approbation of his Contain here appointed having which the which title shall be complete and good-

Fourth-- I direct that debts owing to me be collected and that all the residue of my Estate be sold by my Executor and the funds thus provided to be distributed and paid out as follows-- to my Son-in-law Elliot Eskew one hundred Dollars together with a Sufficient Sum to pay for the purchase of a Side Saddle of ordinary quality- one hundred Dollars to my Son Bryan Burrefs-Five Dollars to my Son John Burrefs--and two Dollars to each of the three youngest children of Joseph Heaton by my deceased daughter- to be paid to them by my Executor as they arrive at ageIf they or either be dead or shall refuse of request to apply for the same within three years of the coming of age then such portion or sum shall be paid to my daughters as the remainder if this fund is directed.
