Third- I give and bequeath to my Wife aforsaid all my property of whatsoever description except Such as may be herein other-wise Specifically bequeathed in fee Simple forever-

Fourth- I give & bequite to my daughter Mary one Mahogany Table, one Large Looking Glafs & fifty dollars in Cash-

Fifth- I give & bequeath to my Grand daughter Nancy Elizabeth Borough one Small Bureau-

Sixth I give and bequeath to my daughter Matilda Borough one writing Desk & one clock to be delivered to my daughter after the death of my Wife and not before-

Seventh- I give and bequeath to my Friend Dr. William Anderson and my Wife Mary Warnock and the Survivor the tract of Land where- on I live in trust for the Special use and and benefit of my daughter Matilda Borough for and during her natural life and after her death to and for the use and benefit with heirs of her body to be distributed amongst them in Such Manner as would be by Law in case of her intestacy Confirming it to her linear

Seventh- I give and bequeath to my Friend Dr. William Anderson and my Wife Hary Warnock and the Survivor the tract of Land where-on I live in trust for the Special use and and benefit of my daughter Matilda Borough for and during her natural life and after her death to and for the use and benefit of the heirs of her body to be distributed amongst them in Such Hanner as would be by Law in case of her intestacy Confirming it to her linear descendents- and to Secure the purposes herein intended the Said Trustees are authorised and empowered to rent the Same from year to year or permit her to remain in pofsefsion & enjoyment thereof or if necessity require to render the Same available Shall have power to Sell and dispose of the Said Lands executing Sufficient titles therefor and either Substitute other lands or otherwise invest the proceeds for the uses & purposes herein-
