Having made arrangements for the settlement of what debts I owe, I deem it unnecessary to say any thing further upon that subject in this my Will.

And lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint my friend, Elijah Willbanks Executor of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former Wills which may have been by me heretofore made. Signed Sealed and Acknowledged, before the subscribing witnesses, who at my request, and in my presence have witnessed the same, on this day the Twentieth of June, in the year of our Lord, One Thousand Eight Hundred & Thirty Eight.
