In the Name of God, Amen, I Samuel Findly Sen of Pendleton County South Carolina, altho weak of Body, yet of Sound mind and Judgement and conSidering the frailty, & certainty of Life, & that it is appointed for all men once to die, I do hereby make my Last will and Testament; in the first Place, I commit my Soul to almighty God who gave my my being, and my body to be buried in a decent manner; as for the Disposing of my world, effects, My mind and will is that first of all, that all my lawfull debts be paid; Nest--I give to my son John Findly the Fum of five shilling Times give to my Daughter Mary Bowen five Shillings Courancy, and to my Daughter Agnes Moore five Shillings courency, & to my son Samuel Findley, one Mare and one bed, and to each of My three Youngest Daughters Elizabeth Margret and Jane Findly (to each one of them) one cow I likewise to my beloved wife Anna Findly do leave and one bed. my land & plantation with the working tools of all kinds & all the Horses And all the Cattle and all the sheep and all the swine and Hogs during her Life while she remains unmarried and at her death the said Land and Plantation Horses, Cattle, sheep, hogs, & swine My will and Desire is; that my Youngest, Son Alexander Findly shall have all the Land and Plantation, Horses Cattle sheep hogs & swine & also all the working tools, I Likewise Constitute & appoint my trusty and beloved wife Anna Findley and Richard Hall my Executors, to see this my will Executed. In Witnefs whereof I the Said Samuel Findly doth hereunto set my hand and seal this first day of September one thousand seven

hundred and ninety four

to be purred In a decent manner; world effects, My mind and will is that first of all, that all my lawfull debts be paid; Nest--I give to my son John Findly the Fum of five shilling give to my Daughter Mary Bowen five Shillings Courancy, and to my Daughter Agnes Moore five Shillings courency, & to my son Samuel Findley, one Mare and one bed, and to each of My three Youngest Daughters Elizabeth Margret and Jane Findly (to each one of them) one cow and one bed. I likewise to my beloved wife Anna Findly do leave my land & plantation with the working tools of all kinds & all the Horses And all the Cattle and all the sheep and all the swine and Hogs during her Life while she remains unmarried and at her death the said Land and Plantation Horses, Cattle, sheep, * hogs, & swine My will and Desire is; that my Youngest, Son Alexander Findly shall have all the Land and Plantation, Horses Cattle sheep hogs & swine & also all the working tools, I Likewise Constitute & appoint my trusty and beloved wife Anna Findley and Richard Hall my Executors, to see this my will Executed.
