WILLIAM ELLIOTT

In the name of God Amen

I William Elliott of South carolina Anderson District Being of Sound mind and disposing memory do make and constitute this my last will and Testament. In the first place I recommend my Soul to God who Gave it and my body to be decently interred, without pomp or Extravagance. And as to what worldly Goods it hath been pleaseing to God to bestow upon me: it is my will and I do positively order that they Should be disposed of in the following manner. First that all my lawfull debts be paid-- I give and bequeath to wife Peanney Elliott during her life to have and to hold the plantation whereon I now live together with all my Stock vz. horse cattle Hogs Sheep and farming tools together with my Household and citchen furniture also my negro woman Farris Elieck Dick and Samuel to have dureing her life time and at her Death the above named negros then to go to my Son Charls Elliott I also give to my grand Daughter Sinthey Ann owens Daughter of my Daughter Nancy owens at the Death of my wife a negro gairl Frankey also at the Dath of my wife my Sons James Elliott and Aihy Elliott to have the plantation whareon I now live to be Eaquelly devided between them also what of the Stock house hold and cichen furniture may remain at the Death of my above name'd wife Peanney Elliott. Lastly I do hereby acknowledge this my last will and testament revoking all former wills by me made, and appoint and constitute Hugh Wilson and my wife Peanney my Executor and Executrix to carry into affect this my last will and testament in witness whereof

without pomp or Extravagance. And as to what should be done it hath been pleaseing to God, to bestow upon me: it is my will and I do positively order that they Should be disposed of in the following manner. Lastly I do hereby acknowledge this my last will and testament revoking all former wills by me made, and appoint and constitute Hugh Wilson and my wife Peanney my Executor and Executrix to carry into affect this my last will and testament in witnefs whereof I have hereunto Set my hand and Seal this 9<sup>th</sup> day of January one thosand Eight Hundred and forty one
