WILL OF

ANN COLDING

In The Name of God Amen --- I Ann Colding of the State of South Carolina Winton County and District of Barnwell being in Sound mind and perfect health But Considering the uncertainty of all Mortall affaire do hereby as my Last will and Testament ordain and Bequeath as follows Regecting all writings heretofore made by me to that purpose -----

First I give and Bequeath my Soul to God and my Body to the Grave to be Decently enterd at the Discretion of my executors Item the Plantation I now Live on Containing fifty acres of Land I give and grant unto my Son James Colding and my Daughter Elizabeth Colding to be equally devided, between the two my Daughter Elizabeth to keep the part the Buildings are on as her place of Residehce untill She Marries and then to be the property of my Son James Colding him and his Hiers forever but in case he Should Die without Lawfull Issue it Shall then Return to my Daughter Elizabeth and her Lawfull Issue But if both Should Die without Lawfull Hiers it Shall then go to the next of Kin item the ~~other~~ ~~two~~ ~~children~~ named Molly and Liddy I give my Daughter Elizabeth her choice of the other which I give unto my Son James Colding and the fellow Named July is to Remain on the Plantation for the use of the family Item I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth my Breeding mare and a young filly but the first Coult the mare has I give unto my grand Son Henry Rowly ----- Item I give unto my Son James Colding one young horse my house and kitchin furniture I give unto my Son James and my Daughter elizabeth to be equally Devided ----- Item the plantation I Purchased on the fifth of March eighteen hundred and five from Mrs Martha Ward Sener I give grant and bequeath the Same unto my Beloved grand Daugh-

and Bequeath as follows Reciting all Writings heretofore made
by me to that purpose -----

ilege of Living using and Detaining of fifty acres of the Said
Lands During her Life time and at her Death to Return to my
grand Daughters Martha Ward Juner and Mary Ward them and their
only proper use and behold forever ---- I do hereby appoint
