Peyton, "and the heirs of her body", one-1 If of his homeplace property on the east side of Lower Three-Runs consisting of exercil treats and containing 110 acres more or less, and the other half was bequeathed to testein's son fustin B. From and the heirs of his body. Said Austin R. Brown effect the bish of issue to him, conveyed his mainty in said lends on Warth 6, 18h7 to sd. Th. H. Fr. on. Said France C. Peyton died (blank date) survived by her said husband Wm. H. Peyton and following children:

The seid Frances S., Josephine and Pauline P., are minors. On the 4 June 1845, Fichard W. Walker, Sheriff of Rammell District sold at public sale all the right and interest of seid Wm. H. Payton in said land to patitioner, John J. Later for \$1615.00. The said Austin B. Brown now has two children, Eliza and Laura Brown, both minors. It is alleged that said Berlin A. Roberts, Vary V. Poberts and William W. Payton are non-residents of the State of South Caroline.

EMHIRIT "A": (sttached to petition) Copy of Last Will and Testament of Tarlton Fromm dated 9 June 1842, probated 19 Sept. 1845; he directed that his body be buried in the Eaptist Churchyard at Foiling Springs and the grave be marked. Fe bequeaths to his

Service of the proceedings was perfected by publication on William W. Peyton*,
B. A. Roberts and Wary V. Roberts, Austin P. Brown and Eliza and Leura Prown, non-residents
of the state. The court ordered the lands sold for division, and same was sold January
1858, to John J. Cater for \$1005.00.

WTm. W. Peyton (above) resided at Stockton, Clinch Co. Ga., about 1860/65, and was Justice of Peace there.
