

WILLIAM CROFSLE

In the name of God, Amen. I William Crofsale of Winton County in Orangeburg District and State of South Carolina, being weak in Body, but of perfect and sound mind and memory, Do make my last Will and Testament in manner & form following, First, I recommend my Soul unto Almighty God, throug the meritts of my Saviour and Redeemer Jesus Christ, and my Body to be decently buried, at the discretion of my Exacutors hereafter named, and what worldly goods, God has blessed me with, I leave in the manner following.

Secondly, I leave to my beloved Wife Rachael Crofsale, one hundred & fifty acres of Land on Ogeechey, part of a Tract of eight hundred and fifty Acres, & she is to have the cleared Land that is on it, & the remainder of her Land, she is to have as convenient to the Clear land as possible; Also a negre Girl known by the name of Cornelia, with her future Increase; Also a feather Bed and one third of the Bed Clothes in my posefsion, Also one Borel Mare, & one Yearling Colt, which she is to have and enjoy durning the course of her natural Life, and at her decease, the above Legacies is to descend to my two Sons I have by my Wife Rachael, named John and Andrew Crofsale, and to their Heirs & Afsigns for Ever, in case my two Sons John & Andrew should dye without Hiers lawfully begotten, then I leave their shares to my sons George & Henry Crofsale & to my Daughter Mary Crofsale Share & Share alike, to their Heirs forEver. Thirdly, I leave to my Son George Crofsale, one Negre fellow known by the name of Ireland, Also two hundred Acres of my Tract of eight hundred & fifty acres on Ogeechey, Also one bay Colt brand C C; Also all my Smiths Tools; Also one feather Bed & Bed Cloaths. Fourthly, I leave to my Son Henry Crofsale, five hundred acres of my Land on Ogeechey; Also one black Horse; Also one feather Bed & Bed Cloaths.-----

Fifthly. I Leave to my Daughter Mary Crofsle, during her natural Life, the Sum of Eighteen pounds Lawful money ^{Per} Year, to be paid to her Yearly, that is to say, Six pounds by my Wife & two Sons John and Andrew Crofsle P Year; Also Six pounds by my Son George Crofsle P Year; Also Six pounds by my Son Henry Crofsle, Out of the Several Legacies that I left them; Also a feather Bed & Cloatha.

Sixly, I leave to my Daughters Anne Murphy and Susannah McMurphy the Sum of one Shilling lawful money each.

It is my Will, in Case either of my two Sons George or Henry Crofsle should Die without Heirs lawfully begotten, then the survivor is to have the whole Legacy, & should both Die without lawful Heirs, then their Legacies is to go to my two Sons John & Andrew Crofsle, Share and Share alike or to the Survivor.

I Appoint my Wife Rachael Crofsle & my Son George Crofsle, Executors to this my last Will, & I do hereby revoke all former Will or Wills by me made, and declare this to be my last Will and Testament; In witness whereof, I have hereunto Set my Hand and Seal, this twenty fifth Day of September, and in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred eighty seven

A Codicil to the Last Will of William Crofsle.

I after that part of my Will, where I leave my Wife to pay (to my Daughter Molly Six pounds Sterl P Year,) during her natural Life; it's my Will, She may have what I have left her free of all Incumberance whatsoever--It is my will they

may live together my family as they now are, untill they
fatten the Hoggs and eat out the Crop that is now made; in
case they should not Choose to live together; Then my Crop.
Hoggs and all my furniture not disposed of, I leave two
thirds of it to George, Henry & Molly Grofse, & the remain-
ing third, to my Wife and my two-- Children by her, In Wit-
ness I have set my Hand & Seal this 1st of November 1787.
