In the name of God amen I John Burnley of Hanover county
york river & Virginia being in a weak state of health tho in
perfect mind & memory blefseed by God for it do make this my
will in manner and form following Viz. in the first place it
is my will and desire that every thing I may be pofsefseed of
both real and personal may be sold and the money arising to-
gether with whatever money maybe owing to me be applied to
the discharge of what maybe indebted and then the remainder af-
ter paying my debts to be dispced of in manner and form as fol-
lows. I give and bequeath to my Brother ~~Zechariah~~ Burnley six
hundred pounds Virginia currency to him and his heirs forever
It is my will & desire that my executors put six hundred
pounds Virginia currency to interest and the interest aris-
ing to be annually paid unto my sister Elizabeth Duke and af-
ter her decease it is my will that the said six hundred pounds
be equally divided betwixt her the said Elizabeth then sur-
viving Children It is my will and desire that my executors
put six hundred pounds - Virginia Currency to interest and the
interest arising to be annually paid to my Sister Keziah Duke
and after her decease it is my will that the said six hun-
dred pounds be equally divided betwixt her the said Keziah
Duke' then surviving children It is my will and desire that my
executors put six hundred pounds Virginia currency to interest
and the interest arising to be annually paid unto my sister
Ann Littlepage wife of Thomas Littlepage and after her decease
it is my will and desire that the said six hundred pounds be

surviving children I give and bequeath to the three sons of

I give and bequeath to the three sons of my sister Judith Meriwether late wife of James Meriweather m Viz. David James and William four hundred & fifty pounds Virginia currency to be equally divided betwixt them, but if - either of them should be dead then the money to be divided betwixt the two survivors and so if two of them should be dead the money to go to the surviving one the should all of them be dead the said four hundred & fifty then to be equally di-

vided betwixt my sisters Elizabeth Keziah & Ann I give and
and bequeath to my prentice George Elsworth one hundred pounds
Virginia currency tho should he be dead it is then my desire
that my executors put the money to interest and the annual
interest to be paid for the schooling poor children in Han-
over county It is my will and desire that my Brothers Hardin
Burnley and Richard Burnley do see this my last will executed
in manner and form as is above directed and after paying the
~~above legacies~~ I give & bequeath to be equally divided be-
twixt my Brothers Harden Burnley and Richard Burnley whatever
money I maybe worth over and above paying the above Legacies--
