In The Name of God, Amen: - Aprilly., 4th., 1802 I John Bush
of the State of South Carolina and district of Barnwell Plant-
er being Verry Sick & week of Body but of a prefect mind & Mem-
ory thanks Thanks be Given to God Therefore Calling to mind the
mortality of the Body and Knowing that it is appointed for all
men once to die do make & ordain this my last will & testament
That is to Say; first and principally I would that my Debts and
funeral Charges Should be paid and Discharged

Item I Would that my Beloved wife Mary Bush Shall have and En-
joy my plantation with all my Other property During her Widow-
hood or until my Youngest child may come to Lawfull age. in
Case She Should Marry I liave to the Discretion of my Execu-
tor to let it Remain with her or take it from her as he or
they may see a prospect of Waste or Improvement.

Item I give and bequeath all my Lands & plantation to be Ea-
qually Divided Among all my Sons at the death or Marriage of
their Mother

Item I ~~give and Bequeath~~ all my Other property of Every Spe-
cie to be Equally Divided Among all my Sons and Daughters
When the Youngest comes of Age. and Lastly I Appoint Consti-
tute and Ordain my Trusty and Beloved friends Isaac Bush &
Thomas Newman to be my Executors to this my Last Will and Tes-
tament. in Witnefs Whereof I have hereunto Set my hand and
Seal the day and year Above Written
