JOSEPH VINCE

In the name of God Amen I Joseph Vince of Savannah River in the District of Barnwell and State of South Carolina Planter, being of Sound and perfect mind and memory blefsee be God for t e same do make and publish this my last will and Testament in manner and form following to Wit: I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Lucy Vince the two tracts of Land whereon I now live during her natural life and then to go to my Son James Robinson Vince I Also give unto wife Lucy Vince all my Household and Kitchen furniture plantation tools and live stock during her natural life and then to be Equally divided among my Heirs I Also give unto my Wife Lucy Vince four Negros Rose Nanny and and her Child Charifsa and Dianna during her natural life and at her Death Nanny and her Child Clarifsa with all her future Issue to go to my Son James Robinson Vince or his lawful Heirs and the other two to be divided among my Heirs as She may think proper: Item I give and bequeath two Negroes John and Also one tract of Land Containing two Hundred and fifty Acres Joining Lande Granted to Jesse Somerall, and one feather bed and furniture to my Son James Robinson Vince upon the following trust to wit: that is to say in trust for the sole benefit and behoof of my Daughter Judith Smith wife of Stephen Smith during her natural life notwithstanding her Said Coverture and without any Kind of Hindrance or Molestation from the Said Husband or being in and manner liable off his debt either the pro perty aforesaid or the profits thereof in any way they may be employed whatsoever and after the death of the said Judith in trust for Such Child or Children as she may then leave living at the time of her death to be

tween them Share and Share alike and then in default of Such  
Issue then in trust for the sole benefit and behoof of my  
other Heirs to be equally divided among them Share and Share  
alike Item I give unto my Son James Robinson Vince one feather  
bed and furniture and three Tracts of Land lying on Savannah

River one Granted to Joseph Vince Containing ~~one~~ hundred and twenty Acres one tract granted to Samuel Alexander Lew Containing two Hundred and fifty Acres and one tract granted to Samuel Alexander Lew Also two Negroes Joe and Dublin to him and his heirs forever Item I give unto my Daughter Nancy Vince one feather Bed and furniture Also three Negroes Sam Chlooe and Henry Also one tract of land Containing one thousand acres lying at the white Ponds Granted to Joseph Vince Item I give and bequeath the following property to wit, three negroes Dick Winney and Sue, one feather Bed and furniture and one tract of Land Containing three hundred and Seventy two Acres granted to William Robison to My Son James Robison Vince upon the following trusts ~~intents and purposes~~ that is to say in Trust for the Sole use Benefit and behoof of My Daughter Betsy Hext wife of William Osborne Hext during her natural life Notwithstanding her Said Coverture and without any Kind of hindrance of molestation from her Said Husband one being in any manner liable for his debts either property also foresaid one the profits ther of- in any way they may be employed whatsoever and after the death of the Said Betsy then in trust for Such Child or Children as She may leave living at the time of her Death to equally divided among them Share and Share alike and in Default of Such Issue then in trust for the Sole use Benefit and behoof of my other Heirs to be equally divided among them Share and Share alike I give and Bequeath unto my Grand Son Thomas B Smith one negroe Boy named Jack- It is my will and desire that the abovementioned property Should be Kept and worked on the plantation where I now live till all my Just debts are paid at the discretion of my executors it also my will if either of my Children should

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now live till all my Just debts are paid at the discretion of  
my executors it also my will if either of my Children Should  
die without Issue that the property Should be Equally dived  
among my other Heirs-And I do hereby nominate constitute and  
appoint my Wife Lucy Vince Executrix and my Son James Robison  
Vince Executor to this my last will and Testament hereby Re  
voking all other will or Wills by me formerly made Declaring  
this only to be my last Will IN WITNESS where of I have here-

unto Set my hand and fixed my Seal this Seventeenth day of  
April in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight Hundred and  
ten and in the thirty fourth years of the Sovereignty and In-  
dependence of the United States of America
