(Jefferson County) being very Sick and weak, but of perfect mind and Memory make this my last will and testament which is to say; Knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die I give and bequeath my Soul to God, who gave it, and my body to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned, and touching at my worldly state which God hath been pleased to bless me with - I give and bequeath them in manner and form following which is to say, first I allow all my debts to be paid and then I give and bequeath to my loving wife Provadance McNeely the one third of my real and personal Estate - Item, to my Son Paul Grimbale McNeely I give and bequeath an other third of my Estate real and personal - Item, to my daughter Sarah McNeely I give the other third of my real and personal Estate and that my two Childrens parts shall remain in the hands of my Executors - until they marry and at the death of my wife Provadance. her third shall be equally divided between my two children vizt Paul Grimbale McNeely & Sarah McNeely and I do hereby constitute and appoint my wife Provadance McNeely & Wm. Murdock to be the whole & Sole Executors of this my last will & Testament and I do hereby disallow disannul and for ever revoke all other wills & legacies left be me hereto fore and this & none other to be my last will and Testament this twenty fifth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & in the twenty fifth year of the Independence of North America as
