RICHARD TREADAWAY

In the Name of God Amen

I Richard Treadaway of Barnwell District in the State of South Carolina being very weak in body but of perfect mind and Memory thanks be given unto god Calling unto mind the Mortality of my body and Knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my Last will and Testament That is to Say principally and first of all I give and Recommend my Soul into the hands of almighty god That gave it and my body I Recommend to the Earth to Be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I Shall Receive the Same again by the mighty power of god; and as Touching Such worldly Estate wherewith It has pleased god to blefs me in this life I give demise and dispose of the Same in the following manner and Form, first I desire that all my Lawfull debts may Be paid, Secondly I Lend to my Dearly beloved wife all My lands with the Buildings and Improvements thereon also all my personal property moveable Effects and household furniture during her natural life or widowhood and after her decease or widowhood I give to my Eldest Son Daniel Treadaway one hundred acres of Land on the East Side of the upper three Runs adjoining The tract I now live on on the Northeast Side of the same being part of tract of one hundred and fifty acres originally Granted to the Said Richard Treadaway also one hundred and four acres adjoining the aforesaid one hundred acres on the East Side of the Same being part of a tract of three hundred and Sixtytwo and half acres of later date granted to the Said Richard ~~Barnwell County~~ ^{Will} 1787-1798

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said one hundred acres on the East Side of the Same being part
of a tract of three hundred and Sixtytwo and half acres of
later date granted to the Said Richard Treadaway which Said
Two hundred acres is bounded on the North Side by Pinnis
Georges Land, Thirdly I give to Richard keel My Grandson one
hundred and four acres adjoining the Later one hundred and
four acres above mentioned to Daniel Treadaway on the South
side of the same in Said later Survey -----
Fourthly I give to my youngest Son Elijah Treadaway the one
hundred and fifty acres of Land being the tract I Now live on

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with the buildings and Improvements Thereon orriginally granted to William West ----- also one hundred and four acres of Land adjoining the aforesaid one hundred and four acres Mentioned to Richard Red on the South side of the same in the aforesaid Later Survey which Said Legacies of Lands by the aforesaid Legatees to be freely pofesed of and Injoyed with

Fifthly all my personal Estate with my household furniture &c, to be Equeally divided by the aforesaid Daniel Treadaway and Elijah Treadaway into three Shares and they Taking one Share each and the other Share I desire to be Sold at the Same time by my Executor on a Credit of Eighteen Months and the Money when Collected to Remain in my Executors hands for him to act with as he Shall See most Benificial for the Said Richard Red untill the Said Richard Red Shall Come to the age of Twentyone years and then he shall be Intitled to Receive from the Said Executor the Sum Remaining at that time of him the Said Richard Red's Coming of age in the said Executors hand and if the Said Richard Red Should Not live to have A Lawfull heir of his own body Then the aforesaid Legacy of Land and Money above Mentioned to him Shall Return and be Equeally Divided between the aforesaid Daniel Treadaway and Elijah Treadaway To be freely pofesed of with their other Legacies and I do hereby Constitute make and ordain My Beloved wife Mary Treadaway Executrix with my Son Elijah Treadaway Executor of this my last will and Testament, and I do hereby utterly disallow Revoke and disanul all and Every Other former Testaments wills Legacies Bequeaths and Executors By me in any wise before Named willed and Bequeathed Ratifying and Confirming this and No Other to be my Last will and Testament in witness whereof

Set my hand and Seal this Eighteenth day of december in the
year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and five and in
the Thirtyeth year of the american Independance
