I Thomas Shaw, being weak in body, but of Sound mind and & Memory, and knowing & believing that my frail mortal body Will Shortly be Comaigned to the Dust & believing that I Shall see Christ my Mediator whom I Shall See for my Self & my Eyes Shall Behold & not anothers, Item I will & Demise in the first place that my frail Body Shall be Decently Interred, Item I will and demise that all my Just debts be punctually & honestly paid; Item my personal property Consisting of about Seven hundred Dollars due me in the State of Georgia I will & bequeath In Manner & form following, that is to Say; Item I will and Bequeath unto my Wifes Eldest Daughter Elizabeth Evans the Sum of one Hundred Dollars paid money to be put out at Interest untill Said Eliz^b arives to the years of Maturity; if Said Elizabeth Evans Dies before She arives at age, then the affore named Sum of One hundred Dollars to be Divided Equally between my Loving Wife Frances Shaw & her Son John Evans; Item I will & bequeath unto my Wifes Son John Evans the Sum of One hundred Dollars to be put out at Interest; & Should the Said John Evans Die before he arives to the age of Twenty one; then in That case the affore, mentioned Sum of One hundred Dollars to fall to my loving Wife Frances Shaw with lawful Interest arising from the Same Lastly I will & Bequeath unto my loving Wife Frances Shaw the Remaining part of my personal property Consisting of Five Hundred Dollars, to be converted to her own private use as a maintainance for her During her Natural life; In Witnes Where of I hereunto Set my hand and affixed my Seal this fifth Day of September one thousand Eight hundred & one, and In the Twenty Sixth year of ~~www.southcarolinapapers.net~~
