October 24th 1735

John Shackelford Enters and Records his mark
as in the Margin and his Ear mark is follows vizt
a slit in the Left Ear and half a crop in the right Ear
for cattle and horses

May 19th 1736

Joseph Harley Enters his Brand as in the Margin and his
mark being an upper half penny in the right Ear and
a saucer in the Left Ear and upper half penny & a crop
for Cattle &c. in St Pauls Church parish

May 20th 1736

Jeremiah Roper Ent Black River Enters his Mark being
two Sharps one in each Ear, and his Brand as in the
Margin.

May 20th 1736

Thos. Eap. Entered his Brand this day for cattle
and stock in Middleton County &c. as in the margin.

May 21st 1736

William James of Williamsburgh Enters his Carman
being a lion on the left ear & a tharpon the right
The Brand as in the Margin.

being a crop and an under half penny in the right ear
and a swallow fish & upper half penny in the left
