Divided amongd them Some of the Survivors of them.
Lastly I give and bequeath unto my friend James Bullock of willmton whom I likewise
Constitute make and ordain Sole Executor of this my Last will and Testament
after all my Debts and funeral Charges are Paid the remainder of my whole
Estate with all my household goods wearing apparel Debts owing to me and
moveable Effects of what sort or kind soever by him freely to be disposed and

By the Tenour of these presents, to administer the Goods, Rights and credits of the said deceased, with his said Testament any manner of way concerning annexed, and to ask, collect, levy, recover and receive the said Goods, Rights and Credits, and to pay the debts in which the deceased stood obliged, so far forth as the said Goods, rights and credits will extend, according to their rate, and order of Law, being first sworn on the holy Evangelists, well and faithfully to administer the same, and to make a full and perfect Inventory thereof and to exhibit the same into the Secretary's Office in Charles Town, at or before the twenty fifth day of November now next ensuing; and to render a true & just account, calculation and reckoning of your said administration when thereunto required. And I do ordain, depuie and constitute you the said Dan^l Green, Administ^r of all and singular the Goods, rights and Credits of the said William Bennett dec^d. with his said Will annexed, by virtue of these presents.

The Last will & Testament of Alexander Gordon.
In the name of God Amen the Twentieth Day of May in the year of our Lord God 1726, I Alexander Gordon in South Carolina being of perfect mind & Memory, Thanks be given unto God therefore Calling unto mind the mortality of my Body, and knowing that it is Appointed for all men once to Die, I do make and ordain this My Last Will & Testament: that is to say, principally, & first of all, I give & Recommend my Soul unto the Hands of God that gave it & for my Body I recommend it to the Earth to be Buried in a Christian like & Decent Manner at the Discretion of my Executors nothing Doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall the Receive the same again by the mighty Power of God, & as touching such Worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life, I give & bequeath & Dispose of the same in the following manner to wit

I give and bequeath to my brother William
 Gordon five hundred Acres of Land in Craven County,
 formerly belonging to William Randolph in the North
 side of Santa River
 I give to my well beloved friends the Reverend
 Mr Hugh Fisher and his brother Mr James Fisher
 Whom I likewise constitute my heirs and Executors my
 only and Sole Executors of this my Last Will and
 Testament Five hundred Acres of Land lying
 to the above named five hundred Acres of my brother
 Which will be known by the Plat of the Township
 News that I shall leave with my Executors All and
 Singular my Lands and Tenements by them to be
 possessed and Enjoyed, and I do hereby utterly by disavow
 revoke and depaunc, all and every other form or Will
 and Legacies and Executors by me in any wise
 before this time made, willed and bequeathed,
 Ratifying and confirming this and no other
 to be my Last Will and Testament In Witness
 Whereof I have set my hand and Seal the day
 and year above written.

Before signing I do order that if my brother comes
 to live here that I give all the above thousand
 Acres unto the above named Executor.

 of March in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & Thirty (Thirty
 one) and of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Second by the Grace of
 God of Great Britain France, Ireland King Defender of the faith &c.
 Joseph Lea of Charles Town Parish of St. Phillips Burley County
 South Carolina Ship Carpenter Being now Weak in body but of Perfect Mind
 and Memory Thanks be given unto God, Therefore Calling unto mind the
 Mortality of my body knowing that it is appointed for all men once
 to Die Do make and Ordain this my Last
 Will & Testament That is to say Principally & first of

Nature and kind, never, and never over-
living and being, and leaving all made me sole
Excutrix of that his said last Will and Testament,
But since the making of this said Will and Testam^t
my said Son George Campfield having had three
Children born to him by the said Elizabeth his Wife
and his own Widow and Relict, which ^{three} Children
are all now living. Therefore I the said Elizabth
Campfield the Elder, could not but think that if
my said Son the said George Campfield, had not been
taken away by a sudden and untimely Death, but
that he would upon the thoughts of his Death, have
revised the said Will, and by another Will have
made Provision for his dear Wife and Children.
Thereupon I the said Eliz^a Campfield the
Elder thinking it unreasonable to insist upon any the
benefit and advantage that might accrue to me by this
Will or Testament. Therefore I do by these pres^{ts}

 possessed of or Entitled unto either in this Province or Else Where having that Confidence
 she will, to manage, as I have always Intended so as to Wrong no body of their Just Due
 it is to my Power to Give them, but I Do hereby make & Ordain my said Wife my
 Executrix Entirely Begging the kind Assistance of my friends in Adjusting Such of
 my Affairs as I may have left unfinished, In Witness whereof I have to
