In the Name of God Amen, the Ninth Day of July, one thousand, two hundred & Thirty Five, I Alicia Ward widow of Charles Lintwate, being very sick & weak in Body, but of perfect mind & memory, doth bequeath to give unto God therefore, calling unto mind the Mortality of my body, & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to Die, Do make & Ordain, this my Last will & Testament, that is to say, Principally & first of all, I give and Recommend my soul into the Hand of God that gave it & my body I recommend to the Earth, to be buried in decent Christian Burial at the Discretion of my Executors, Nothing Doubting, but at the general Quarrel, I shall Revive the same again, by the Mighty Power of God, to a. Touching such worldly Estate, as it hath pleased God to bestow, me in this life, I give Tenpence to People of the same, in the following manner, from: **IMPROVISUS** to give & bequeath to my well beloved Daughters Sarah Ward & Mary Ward, one Thousand Nine hundred & forty five Pounds Nine Shillings Current Money of this Province, Due to me from my Son in Law William Lintwate, on a Bond Dated the Twenty fourth Day of June, one thousand Seven hundred & thirty Two, with the Interest thereon together with the said Bond, to be Equally Divided between my two Daughters, Sarah Ward & Mary Ward, excepting the hundred Pounds, part thereof which I give to my loving Daughter Eleanor Lintwate, & in sum Pounds Past HUNDRED, to my Grand Daughter Anna Maria Lintwate 818 hundred Pounds to my Grand Son Thomas Lintwate, **ITEM** Watch I give to my loving Daughter Eleanor Lintwate, to my Grand Daughter Anna Maria Lintwate I give my two year old Silver Cup & two Daughters, Sarah Ward & Mary Ward, I give to bequeath all my Goods, in the Shop pertaining to me, whether bought in my name or in the name of my Daughters, Sarah, & Eleanor Lintwate, to my Grand Daughter Anna Maria Lintwate I give my two year old Silver Cup & two Daughters, Sarah Ward & Mary Ward, I give to bequeath all my Goods, in the Shop pertaining to me, whether bought in my name or in the name of my Daughters, Sarah, & Eleanor Lintwate, Sarah Ward & Mary Ward, & the residue of my Plate & Servile to my two Daughters, Sarah & Mary, I give to bequeath to my two Daughters, Sarah & Mary, to my Executors to Apportion my two Daughters, Sarah & Mary sole Executrices of this my Last Will & Testament

I Give, Directly and Bequeath unto my Father Richard Meade, to my Brother John and unto each of my three Sisters, Mary, Martha, & Catherine, the sum of fifty pounds, Sterling Money, to each of them — — — — —
