In the Name of God Amen! I, Ann Huger, being of sound and dispos-
ing mind, do make this my last Will and Testament: To the earth I commit
my body; to Almighty God I yield my Soul, hoping for mercy and forgiveness
of all my sins. I own at present a bond of John Gordon and a bond of my son
John Huger, together amounting to fifteen thousand Dollars. In my house there
is some plate, furniture &c &c. To each of my sons, I give one third of my pro-
perty held in the bonds above mentioned, upon condition that my sons John
and Alfred do pay to Alfred Benjamin five hundred Dollars each, before
they take their share, for the purpose of buying a mechanic, which I ought to
have given him to put him on a footing with them. My son John is to take
his Bond, now in my possession as part of his third of my property. It is my
wish that my son Alfred should not be called upon for any money, which
might appear to be due by him to me but which, in fact, is not, nor is any
such apparent indebtedness to interfere with, or, in any manner, affect
the one third of my estate herein bequeathed to him. To my son Benja-
min I give (as I have already done) two small silver waiters, a silver teapot
and some gravy spoons, also the pictures in my front room. To my son Alfred
I give the Coasters. The rest of my plate, and all other articles in the house

make and declare this to be my last will and Testament. First, I leave
my daughter Katy and her present and future issue and increase to the
care and protection of the free portions of my family, to hold them in the
same manner, as I have myself hitherto held her. It is further my will
~~and desire~~, that if my other slaves shall desire to be sold or if the sale of
them be deemed expedient for the good of my Estate, my Executor shall
have full power and authority to dispose of them to the best advantage. I
also wish my boats to be sold and my horse and out of the proceeds my
debts to be paid. The house and lot where I reside at present, I wish to
be kept as a residence of my family, that is to say that my wife is to reside
there (or have the right to do so) during her life, my children till marriage
or till they arrive at full age. My son in Law and daughter have built
a house on the lot in which I reside.
