In the Name of God Amen, I Ann Puicell of Charleston widow, being mindful of the uncertainty of life, do make this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all others: First, My debts and funeral expences being first paid I give and devise all my Estate as follows viz: To Eliza Bonsall Holmes daughter of M^{rs} Ann Glover Holmes, I give and bequeath my female servant named Judy with her four children Anne, Tom, Joe and Caroline with the future issue of the females, the said negroes with their issue to be held in Trust for her by her Brother Francis S Holmes and her Brother in Law George Thresholme and the survivor of them and the Executors or Administrators of such survivor, so that the profits of the labor of said Slaves shall be paid to her during

ing her natural life and at her death the said slave with her issue
go to her children should she have any, or should she die without issue
living at her death, then to such person or persons as she may by deed or will
appoint and on failure to make such appointment to her right heirs
forever. And I hereby give power to the said trustees or the survivor
them at the request of said Eliza B Holmes to sell said slave and to
invest the proceeds in other property subject to the same trusts. I also give
and bequeath to said Eliza B Holmes all my Mahogany and Wooden
furniture except two large Mahogany chests containing all my best Bed
Linen, Table linen, Curtains, Quilts, Pavillions and so forth, which chests with
the whole of their contents, I give and bequeath to my affectionate and beloved
Cousin Elizabeth Farr Hayne and I also give to her the choice of any piece
or pieces of the above furniture she may fancy. Second. Whereas I hold
two Bonds of Dr Horace Waring (for two thousand & five hundred Dollars
under a grateful sense of his kind services to my dearly beloved Brother
during his long and distressing illness and his kindness to me since
his death, I give and bequeath unto the said Horace Waring out of the
said Bonds one thousand Dollars; one other thousand Dollars out of said
Bonds, I give and bequeath unto my much respected Cousin Mr Susan M
H. Boone and the remaining five hundred Dollars due on said Bonds
I give and bequeath unto my friend and Cousin Mr Ann Glover Holmes
and I hereby declare it to be my wish that he should not be distressed
by the speedy enforcement of said Bonds. In grateful acknowledgements
for the testimony of respect paid to the Memorial of my late Brother

and sum, one thousand Dollars and should he die before me then the said sum to go to his children, share and share alike. Third. As it is my desire as far as the law will permit, to give my colored Woman Jenny her own time after my death and as my said Woman though now fully able to support herself may by ~~sickness~~ or old age be deprived of the ability to do so, I give the said Woman and the sum of one thousand Dollars unto William ^{and my wife} ~~Elizabeth F Hayne~~ Hayne, in trust that they will make such arrangements as they may think best calculated to carry my wishes in this respect into effect and I further declare it to be my Will that the said sum of one thousand Dollars shall be invested in some safe stock and the interest thereof be suffered to accumulate, and should the situation of said woman require it, that so much of the interest or income as may in their opinion be necessary be applied to her support and from and after the death of said Woman Jenny I give and bequeath the said stock with its accumulation to the said William and Elizabeth Hayne or the survivor of them and the heirs executors and administrators of such survivor free from any further trust. Fourth. Entertaining for my kind affectionate and favorite relation Elizabeth Fane Hayne the highest regard and my heart ever flowing with the warmest gratitude to her husband William A Hayne for the great and uniform kindness to me in the hour of my deepest affliction which I feel that I cannot repay, I do in testimony of these feelings give and bequeath unto the said Elizabeth F. and William A Hayne all the rest and residue of my Estate real and personal, to have and to hold the same unto them jointly during their joint lives and after the

Haynes by deed or Will to determine what disposition shall be made of the same
after the death of her said Husband, the said parties to have power to sell and
dispose of said property during their joint lives, investing the proceeds in other

it to be my wish that in disposing of any of my servants they make as far
as may be reasonable be suffered to choose their owners.

Estate to William A. Hayne absolutely & declare that it is my Will and in-
tention that he shall stand in the place of his late Wife and have in his
own right all the property devised to her in my Will. Given under my hand
