Item I give and bequeath to David Christie the only surviving and now blind son of my old and intimate acquaintance Mr Joanna Christie Three hundred Dollars.

Item I give and bequeath unto the Presbyterian Church of the City of Charleston of which I have been so long a Member Three hundred Dollars.

Item I give and bequeath to the orphan House of Charleston for the benefit of that Institution Three hundred Dollars.

Item, My Dear deceased Step Father George Macaulay in and by his last Will and Testament among other things gave and bequeathed to me the use for my life of his three servants Betty Mary and Richard and the future issue of the female with the power to dispose of them in my life time or in and by my last Will and Testament in such a manner as I may think best for their welfare & with a view to the welfare of those servants and their issue I wish to ^{exercise} ~~execute~~ the power so ~~vested~~ in me by Step Father's said Will, and I have also since his death purchased the servant Fanny that belonged to his Estate. Item, I give devise and bequeath all the rest residue and remainder of my Estate real & personal whatsoever and wheresoever unto my Brother Daniel Macaulay his heirs and assigns, and should my said Brother Daniel die before me, then and in that case I give devise and bequeath all the said rest residue and remainder of my Estate Real & Personal unto

my death, to be equally divided among them share and share alike of one
one, and if one then to that one his or her heirs and assigns forever.

Lastly, I constitute, nominate and appoint my Brother Daniel Macaulay
and my friend Mitchell King, Executors of this my last Will & Testament,
hereby revoking and annulling all former and other wills by me at any time
heretofore made and ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my
