Wadley the negro man Joe, already in his possession and two hundred dollars;
Item to Mrs Sarah Ballou my Daughter, wife of James L. Ballou Esquire three thousand
dollar; the legacy to be enjoyed by her free from the control or debt of
her husband, and to be converted into Stock at the discretion of my executors
the interest whereof I direct to be paid to her the said Sarah for and during her
life, and at her death, the principal to go to such child or children of her as shall
she shall by will or writing in the nature thereof, designate and appoint and in
default of such appointment to and among the said children living at her
death, share and share alike. Item to my son Charles Wadley five thousand
two thousand dollars; Item to my son Thomas Wadley three thousand
two thousand dollars, Mary-carr, Diana and Peter, with the future issue of the
latter; also all the money I have unexpended at my house and my above
hired full that of the sum above bequeathed I direct my pecuniary legatees to
divide

In as much as my marriage has not been blessed with issue of my own and
bequeath to my wife Mary J. Wilson in case of her death and
of my Estate Real and Personal all of her moneys appertaining thereto
the bed and its usual Furniture and the sum of eight hundred dollars
to be paid her in ~~legal~~ annual instalments (always to be paid in
advance) until the whole sum is paid.
