N. 8. In the Name of God Amen. I Anne Warley, widow of Felix Warley,
deceased, of Charleston, in the State of South Carolina, do make and declare
this to be my last Will and Testament: Inprimis, I Give to my son Jacob
Warley the negro man Joo, already in his possession and Two hundred Dollars;
I Give to Mr Sarah B. Miller my Daughter, wife of James B. Miller Esquire three thou-
sand Dollars; this legacy to be enjoyed by her free from the control or debts of my
husband, and to be converted into stock at the discretion of my executors
the interest whereof I direct to be paid to her the said Sarah, for and during her
life, and at her death, the principal to go to such child or children of her as shall
she shall by will or writing in the nature thereof, designate and appoint; and in
default of such appointments to and among her said children living at her
death, share and share alike. I Give to my son Charles Warley I Give and
bequeath three thousand Dollars; I Give, to my son Thomas Warley three thou-
sand Dollars; I Give to my Daughter Ann E. Warley, five thousand Dollars and
the three negroes, Mary Ann, Diana and Peter, with the future issue of the
female; also all the money I leave unexpended at my decease and my silver
should fall short of the sums above bequeathed I direct my pecuniary legacies to be paid

gates to abate proportionably. Then I bequeath Charles Wesley and also I bequeath
aforsaid my executor and Executors, and another all other wills heretofore made.

No. 9 State of South Carolina. I Charles Willson of Charleston District
of James Goose Creek Parish State aforesaid above planter, do make
and declare this my last Will and Testament in manner and form fol-
lowing. First, I Direct that all my Lawfull debts be paid as soon after my
decease as possible out of the first moneys that shall come into the hands
of my Executor, from any portion of my Estate real or personal. Secondly
In as much as my marriage has not been blessed with issue, I give and
bequeath to my wife Mary F Willson in lieu of her dower and third
of my Estate Real and Personal all of her wearing apparel, One Year
- then bed and its usual Furnitures and the sum of Eight hundred Dollars
to be paid her in equal annual instalments (always to be paid her in
advance) until the whole sum is paid.
