bequeath to my God Daughter Miss Pamela Duquerscon of Charleston
South Carolina United States of North America, a sum of Ten
Thousand francs which the Executors of my Will will pay her out
of the fund which the Father of the said Miss Pamela Duquerscon
has received on my Account and keeps at my disposal. Second Clause
I give and bequeath to my eldest Son Antoine Louis Charet as a
portion over and above his equal share in my Succession with my
other Children (French-par Preciput others part) 1st Twenty shares which
are my property in the Bank of France. 2nd My House in which I live now

of whatever kind it may be, the library books, Wines which are in the cellars,
in short every thing to be found in the house at the time of my death, except
the Species, my Port-folio, and all the Bills of exchange, and ~~any~~ ^{any} bonds
which belong to me, amounting at present at One hundred and thirty
one thousand francs. Third Clause I give and bequeath to my wife
the mother of my children during her life an annuity of Two thousand
one hundred francs which will be paid her semi-annually without
any reservation by my six children each contributing for three hundred
and fifty francs, and to secure the payment of the said annuity or annual
pension, I authorize my wife to take a mortgage on the forty shares which
I possess in the Bank of Havre. Fourth Clause I give and bequeath
all the property which I possess in France and of which I have not disposed
in the above clauses, together with every other property I have or may have in
any Country of the world to my six children - viz Celestine Chanet, the wife
of Mr Camperdon Fifth - Antoine Louis Chanet, Andre Jean Chanet, Emma
Chanet, Prissilia Chanet, and Antoinette Chanet, to be divided between
them in six equal shares forever, and liable to the annuity I have settled on
their mother as specified in the third clause. Fifth Clause I appoint
and constitute as Executors of my Will my two sons Antoine Louis and Andre
Jean Chanet. Sixth Clause In order to prevent any difficulty which
might arise from the difference between the names of Anthony and
Antoine, I will remark that from the moment I arrived in the United States

in French. I have also signed Anthony in every deed document and
transaction in which I was concerned here ~~and~~ in France &c. The
present Will drawn at Valence & Agen, in my Chamber, facing the south,
written and signed with my own hand on the twenty fifth day of January
eighteen hundred and thirty nine. Signed Anthony Chavet.
I conform in every respect the above Will except in what concern the legacy
of Ten thousand francs bequeathed to my God daughter Pernelle Duquesne
-ron which I reduce to Five thousand francs. Drawn on the
same day and year as above. Signed Anthony Chavet.
