Know all men by these presents that John Archibald Hamilton  
of York Co County in the Province aforesaid am held &  
bound unto John Harleston of the same place in  
the sum of Just Sum of three hundred pounds Sterling money  
of Great Britain to be paid to the said John Harleston at  
Post Office Attorney His Executors or Assigns to which I  
may now well & freely to be made I bind myself my heirs &  
successors firmly by these presents to pay with my Seal  
dated the thirteenth day of January anno Domini 1781.

Rocke Esq<sup>r</sup> of Shrewsbury Patrick Rocke of the said Budget & now  
living in Ireland or to one or more of the said Children to  
any other person or persons according to the direction of the devise  
of the said Budget & shall also pay further to the said Budget to make  
execute a letter of attorney under her hand & Seal to the said Johnne  
Harleston as to any office Person or Persons at any time when  
she shall think fit to receive one hundred Pounds or one hundred  
pounds Sterling & to dispose of the same according to her  
direction to any one or more of the said Children or to any other person
