of *Mary Madsen* late of the Parish of Christ Church in this Province the
Dowry whereunto any of the Goods of the said Dowry are or so remain in
the said parts and places which shall be shown to You by the said *Mary Madsen*
and there View and Appraise all and every the said Goods being first sworn on the
Evangelists of Almighty God to make a full and perfect Inventory and Appraisal
and to Cause the same to be returned under Your Hand or any three or four of You
the Secretary's Office in Charles Town in Order to be Recorded on or before the first
Day of May next ensuing

Letter Testimony to *Elias Hancock* Esq. 26

By the Honble Arthur Middleton Esq. President
and Governor in Chief in and over his Majesty's
Provinces of South Carolina and Ordinary of the same

To all to whom these Presents shall come Greeting
Know ye That on the Ninth Day of January in the year of our said
Majesty's second hundred and Twenty Ninth the last Will and Testament of *Elias*
Hancock late of Charles Town in this Province a Merchant deceased, was Proved,
Approved, and Allowed of, the said Dowry having whilom lived and at the time of
his Death, diverse Goods, Rights and Credits within the Province aforesaid, by
means whereof the Approbation and Allowance of his Testament, and the Power of
Granting the Remission of all and singular the Goods Rights and Credits of the said
Dowry, to us it manifestly known to belong, and that the Remission of all and
singular the Goods Rights and Credits of the said Dowry and his Testament any
manner of way, Considering was Granted unto his Widow *Mary Hancock* and
Executor in his said last Will and Testament, being sworn on the Holy Evangelists of
Almighty God well and faithfully to Administer, and make a full and perfect Inventory
of all and singular the Goods, Rights, and Credits of the said Dowry and to Exhibit
the same into the Secretary's Office in Charles Town in Order to be Recorded on or
before the first Day of May next ensuing and to render a full and true Account
Calculated and Forbearing thereof when thereunto required
