No. 26 In the Name of God Amen. I Augustus Theodore Gaillard
of Charleston, South Carolina, being of Sound Mind, do make and
declare this my last Will and Testament.

In the first place, I desire that all of my just and lawful debts be
may be paid.

Item, I give and bequeath unto my Executors and Executors hereinafter
named, my whole Estate Real and Personal, in Trust only nevertheless, for
the following uses and Interests viz: I give to them my said Executors and
Executors in trust for my Beloved Wife Joanna, one half of my whole es-
tate, real and personal, during her natural life (provided she does not
marry a second time) and at her death (if so unmarried) I give said
half of my Estate (so left to her during her life) to such child or children
the issue of her marriage with me, as she may bequeath the same to,
by Will. Should my said Wife Joanna (being unmarried) die without
a Will, I desire that the said half of my Estate, be divided among my
children, or their issue, share and share alike. Should my said Wife
Joanna marry a second time, I desire that the aforesaid half of my Estate,
so held in trust for her during her widowhood, shall immediately #

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upon her marriage, be no longer held subject to her use, but be held by my Executors, in trust for my Children or their issue, and then their heirs forever, and share alike.

I give to my Executors and Executors aforesaid, in trust for all my children, ~~whether~~ or now born or to be born, and their heirs forever, the remaining half of my Estate, Real and Personal there and there alike.

I desire that my Executors and Executors aforesaid pay one to each of said Children upon the day of their marriage, or when they arrive at the age of twenty one years, the full proportion of my Estate, to which they may be entitled. Should either of or any of my children die unmarried or before they arrive at the age of twenty one years, and leave no issue, I desire that the share of such child or children may be divided among my other children in equal shares. Should any of my children die, leaving issue I desire that such issue may inherit the full share of his, her or their parent, in my Estate. Should all of my children die unmarried, without leaving a Will, or having been married, die without a Will, and leave no issue, and when all are so deceased, my wife Joanna, still survive them, and said wife, not having married a second time, I give and bequeath, in that event, the whole of my said Estate Real and Personal to her and her heirs forever.

I give to my Executors and Executors full power to dispose of my Estate real and personal, either at public or private sale and at such times as they may deem most advisable, and if sold to invest the same, in such manner as may be most advantageous to the interests of the above trusts.
