

Box 3 Georgia Newton County - I Catharine McFarlane of the City
No 6 of Charleston & State of South Carolina do make and publish this
as my last Will & Testament. First my lot on Aswell Street in Charleston
adjoining Torrys & Pritchards lots, I wish sold at such time and
upon such terms, as a majority of the Adult devisees mentioned in
this Clause of my Will may agree upon, and the proceeds divided equa-
ly between my daughter Ann A Andrew & Catharine Mood my son
James J. McFarlane and my grand son Alexander M. Wynn in-
specially naming my daughters in this Clause and not their husbands,
it is my design and Will that they should take the proportions be-
queathed to them herein as well as in every subsequent Clause to
their sole and separate use; but it is my will and desire that their
husbands be and act as trustees for them respectively. Second upon
the terms & trusts just mentioned I give to my daughter Catharine
Mood my negro Girl Maria and all all my bedding and furniture
not herein otherwise disposed of. Third upon the same terms & trusts
I give to my daughter Ann A Andrew my boy Billy, my gold watch
and the miniature likeness of her father. Fourth to Catharine Anne
Sarah. Fifth I give to Elizabeth M. Andrew & Sarah A. An-
drew a half dozen silver table spoons each. Sixth I give my
large feather Bed bolster & pillows to Henrietta Lucy Andrew. Seventh
to Mary C Andrew & Octavia O Andrew I give a half dozen silver

Fourth I give to Miss Elizabeth Mason, daughter of the late Thomas Mason of New York I give a half dozen silver table spoons. Fifth I desire that a suit of mourning be furnished to my daughter Selina Smith of Charleston at the expense of my Estate. Sixth when I have not the Articles bequeathed in the fifth, seventh and eighth clauses of this will, I desire that they may be purchased to satisfy said bequests. Eleventh I desire that when the debts and charges upon my Estate shall have been satisfied out of the sum due me, the remainder of said sum be held by John Moor for the education and maintenance of his children, to be applied principal or interest, as he in his discretion may think proper.

Twelfth I give to James O Andrew my girl Lucy and one fourth of the proceeds of the lot mentioned in the first clause in trust to apply the interest and annual income arising therefrom to the education and Maintenance of Alexander M Wynn until he come of age when said sum and said Negro with her increase is to be delivered to said A M Wynn discharged of the trust.

Lastly. I appoint John Moor & the Revd James O Andrew executors of this will. In testimony of all which I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 27 March 1840
