This Indenture made the twenty fifth day  
of February anno Domini One thousand seven hundred  
and twenty nine, and in the third year of the reign of  
our Sovereign King George the Second by the Grace of  
God of Great Britain France and Ireland King Defender  
of the faith et cetera Charles Burnham of  
the parish of St Philip Charlestown in Berkeley County  
in the province of South Carolina planter and Executor of  
the last Will and Testament of his father Charles Burnham  
late of Berkeley County aforesaid planter deceased of the  
prospect and prospect sum or value of Charlestown  
affixed in the said province of South Carolina say  
and Iohn Raper of Charlestown citizen of the said  
part where eas at the last Court of Common Pleas  
held at Charlestown aforesaid before me Richard Albin  
Esq; and his Assistant Justice of the said Court in the  
Month of February instant Thomas Elliot of Berkeley  
County planter by the name of Thomas Elliot obtained  
a Judgment and recovered of the said Charles Burnham party  
therein to recover a certain Obligation of the said Charles the  
Indenture made by him in his lifetime and dated the first  
day of May in the year of our Lord One thousand seven  
hundred and twenty four. The sum of three thousand  
five hundred and forty two pounds ten Shillings Current  
money and also the sum of Two hundred pounds Shillings  
Current money for his said Thomas's  
Damages which he had sustained as well by reason of  
the execution of the said Indenture after his death and Charge  
in that behalf sustained of the goods and chattels which  
were of the said Charles the Testator at the time of  
his death in the hands of the said Charles party here

for administration of justice in his hand he had not known  
Nor was Damages of his proper Goods and Chattels of the  
said Charles the Esq; to be Seized as by the Record of the  
and Judgment remaining in the said Court may more fully  
appear And Whereas an Execution upon the Judgment  
of said Cause levied a Fieri Facias Issued out of the  
said Court bearing Date the Nineteenth day of this instant  
affidavit you returne that the next Court of Session shall  
be held at the Second Fri Day in May next pursuant to the  
present Statute of this Province & Order by George  
King of England and St. S. Provis of Martiall of Ward  
providing for the several Slave-holders & Owners  
and their in his Custody had and retained unto this day  
the date hereof And whereas before the said Date  
present to the said Thomas Elliot and the said Charles  
Burcham party hereto amounted to a summe of £  
for the principall & Interest of the several debts  
Upon which the Judgment aforesaid was obtained  
And there was laid due thirteenth unto the said Thomas  
Elliot The sum of One thousand and One hundred and thirty  
five pounds Eleven Shillings and one penny Current  
money and the said Thomas Elliot at the said instant  
and request of the said Charles the Esq; did agree to discharge  
the said Several Slave-holders in Especiall attitute as  
agreed and to accept now £  
for the said summe payable  
at his Several days thereinafter mentioned with Inter-  
est from today And it h[as] beene In pursuance to the  
said Agreement made Tuesday Somererville John Rapp  
at the said Instant and request of the said  
Charles Burcham party hereto And for the discharge  
the said sum of One thousand and One hundred and thirty five  
pounds Eleven Shillings and one penny and now the  
aforesaid Obligation have to pay the Execution and

Delivery hereof on to two Several Obligations each  
equally with these presents unto the said Thomas Elliot  
The one in the penalty of One thousand two hundred & twenty  
pounds Lawfull money of South Carolina with Condition  
that he will make to be paid on the payment of the sum of  
One hundred thirty five pounds Eleven Shillings and one penny  
of Lawfull money together with Lawfull Interest to be  
computed from the date hereof on or before the twenty fifth  
day of August next ensuing the other Obligation in the penalty  
of Two thousand two hundred pounds Lawfull money  
to be paid on or before the twenty fifth day of February which will be  
in the year of our Lord One thousand Seven hundred and thirty  
and six by the said Last Several written Obligation now in the hands of  
the said Thomas Elliot relation being hereto laid may more  
fully appear Now this Indenture witness with both  
parties aforesaid for the better securing of the payment of the said  
Several sum of One hundred thirty five pounds Eleven Shillings  
and one penny with Interest at per cent One Thousand and One hundred pounds

Eleven Shillings & one pence lawful money of  
South Carolina forwarded with Lawfull interest to  
compute from the day of the delivery of this instrument  
to him on by fifth day of August next ensuing  
which will be in the year of our Lord One thousand  
Seven hundred & Thirty Two also the sum of

To all people to whom these presents shall come,  
I the within named Testator do make my Last Will and Testament  
Whereas the within named Charles Burnham did accuse

the several Negroes or Slaves therin mentioned as aforesaid  
On the Condition of for the Indemnity as to those  
so accused. And Whereas Howard Charles Burnham  
has not complied with the several Articles previously  
Conditions theron expressed. And that the said John  
Trapier is gone departed from this province without  
me giving any satisfaction for or on account of trapping  
within mentioned so that it has been wholly left  
alleged to make satisfaction for the several matters  
therin contained. And Whereas the said John Trapier  
has made no attorney or power to do  
to make all matters & things relating to the within  
promised &c &c known therefore that it has  
been agreed between us and with the consent and  
approbation of Howard Charles Burnham Testator  
by his signing here to Joseph Townsend & Mary  
his wife having made unto his said Testator herein  
after John Trapier full satisfaction of the said  
several conditions within aforesaid which of  
righting it to have been kept & performed by the  
said Charles Burnham have granted & given  
to him by these presents do grant & give  
to him unto his said Joseph Townsend & Mary  
his wife his or their heirs & executors & assigns  
as well therein more fully promissed. The several Negro  
slaves & molatto slaves herein particularly named  
as the said several Indentures or Mortgages etc.
