

I John Franchlyn of the County of York in the Province of Carolina Merchant have Committed, executed and Made one in my Head and Place Set out by these Presents to be Constituted make one in my Head and Place put Mr. John Laddel Gent. of Boston New England to be my True Sufficient and Lawfull Attorney for me and in my name and Head and to my life to Ask Demand Levy Require Recover & Receive of & from all & every Person Persons Whomever the same shall and may Concern all & singular some and Sums of money Debt goods wares Merchandise Effects and Things whatsoever and Whomever they shall and to be found Due Owring Payable Belonging & Coming unto me the Constituant by any Ways and means whatsoever nothing Reserving or Reserving Grant and hereby Granting unto my said Attorney my full and whole Strength Power and Authority in and about the Premises & to take & Use all Due Means Course and Process in the Law for the Obtaining & Recovering the same & of Recoveries & Receipts thereof in my Name To Make Seal and Execute Due Acquittances & Discharges w^{ch} for the Premises to Appear & the Term of me the Constituant to Represent before any Governor Judges Justices Officers and Minister of the Law whatsoever In any Court or Court of Judicature And there on my behalf to Answer Defend and Reply unto all Actions Causes Matters and Things whatsoever Relating to the Premises With full Power to Make and Substitute one or more Attorneys under him my said Attorney and the same Again at the Pleasure Revoke & Generally to say Do Act Transact Determine Accomplish and finish all Matters and Things w^{ch} Relating to the Premises as Fully Ample and Effectually to all Intents and Purposes as I the said Constituant ought or might Personally altho the Matter should Require more special Authority than is herein Comprised I the said Constituant Ratify Approve and Confirm from and Vouch all and whatsoever my said Attorney or his Substitutes shall Lawfully do or Cause to be Done In and About the Premises by Virtue of these Presents In Witness whereof I have hereunto Set

In the name of God Amen I Charles Ruddy of Port Royal in the Province of Sth Carolina (gent^l) being Weak in body but Sound and Perfect Memory (Praised be God for the same) and Calling to Remembrance the Uncertainty of This Transitory Life do make and Declare this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form following (that is to say) First and Principally I Recommend my Soul into the Hands of Almighty God my Creator and Redeemer Trusting and assuredly believing that I shall Receive full Pardon and full Remission of all my sins through the alone Merits of Jesus Christ my blessed Saviour and Redeemer my body I commit to the Earth from Whence it was Taken to be buried in such Decent &

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Christen John, I have as my last Will and Testament bequeathed and as touching such worldly Estate as the Lord in Mercy hath sent me after my Debts and funerals Expenses are paid and Defrayed I do Give Devise and bequeath the same unto my Loving friends Nathaniel and Thomas Boston of Charles Town North whom I do hereby nominate and Appoint full and Sole Executors of this my Last Will and Testament hereby Revoking all former Wills by me made as Witness my hand the August the 29 Anno Dom 1732

S. Carolina Mortgage by Emanuel Smith to John Hanyarne

KNOW all men by these Presents that I Emanuel Smith of New dwelling in the Parish of St. Paul in Beaufort County in the Province of South Carolina Planter for and in Consideration of a Sum of Three hundred and fifty Pounds Current Money with these Presents Whom I the said Emanuel Smith am bound and boundly do Stand Bound unto John Hanyarne Junr of St. Pauls in the County aforesaid Gentl. in the Small Sum of Seven hundred and thirty Pounds Current Money of South Carolina Committed for the Payment of three hundred and fifty and five Pounds like Current Money on the first day of January Next ensuing as by the said Recited Obligations and Commissions with more at Large appear and for the better Securing the said Sum of three hundred and fifty and five Pounds Current Money to be Paid as aforesaid have bargained sold let over and deliver unto the said John Hanyarne Junr one Negro man by names Tom Eufus Simon and Jack de Boase and sold the said four Negroes men by Names Tom Eufus Simon and Jack unto the said John Hanyarne Junr his heirs Executors administrators and Assignes for Ever and I the said Emanuel Smith for my self my heirs Executors and Assignes the said four Negroemen by name Tom Eufus Simon and Jack unto the said John Hanyarne Junr his heirs Executors administrators and Assignes against all Persons shall and will Warrant and for Ever Release by these Presents Provided nevertheless that if the said Emanuel Smith my heirs Executors administrators or any of us do Well and Truly Content and Pay or Cause to be Paid unto the said John Hanyarne Junr his heirs Executors administrators the said Sum of Three hundred and fifty and five Pounds Current Money of South Carolina On the said first day of January Next According to the True Intent and Meaning of the above Recited Obligation and Commission for Redemption of the above said Bargained Promises then this Present Bill of Sale and Every thing therein mentioned and Contained to be utterly Void and of None Effect or Else to be and remain in full force and Virtue in Witness whereof I together with Delivery of the said Bargained Promises I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this sixth day of April In the Year of our Lord 1732
