

Deed of Gift by David Shillitoe to the four
children of John Driver

To all Christian People to whom these
presents shall come David Shillitoe sends Greeting
in our Lord God Everlasting
I know ye that I the said David Shillitoe
for and in consideration of the Love good Will and
affection which I have & do bear towards the
four Children of John Driver VIZ Elizabeth Sarah
John & William Driver Have given
and granted and by these presents do freely and
absolutely Give and Grant to the said four Children
of John Driver VIZ Elizabeth Sarah John
& William Driver my whole Estate both real and
personal moveables & immoveables one Lane house
or houses cattle horses hoggs and also all my household
Goods and all or every thing or things that I
may or can properly call my own & it in what
hands or Custody soever they or any part of them
Ever shall or may now or hereafter be found But
never the less all the debts of my Wife's first husband
shall be first paid, and the remaines of my Estate
as aforesaid shall be equally divided between the
four Children Elizabeth Sarah John & William
Driver To have & to hold the said Land house
or houses cattle horses hoggs & all the premises
aforesaid unto the said Children their heirs
or assigns from hence forth as their proper Goods
or Estate forever Absolutely without any manner
of Condition only the paying of the debts of my
Wife's former husband John Driver as aforesaid
