Know ye That on the Eighteenth Day of December in the Year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and Twenty nine The last Will and Testament of Master John Hutchinson late of Charles Town in this Province Deceased was Proved, Approved, and allowed of, The said Deceased having whilst he lived, and at the time of his Decease, Dying Goods, Rights, and Benefits, within the Province of Maryland, of the Approbation and allowing of his Testament, and the power Granting the Administration of all and singular the Goods, Rights, and Benefits, of the said Deceased, to me is manifestly known to belong, And that the Administration of all and singular the Goods, Rights, and Benefits, of the said Deceased, and his due and lawful Executorship was Comitted unto his beloved Charlotte Hutchinson and Mr. Robert Hume named Executors in the said last Will and Testament.
