To all People to whom these Presents shall Come I Edward Hussey of the Parish of Saint Andrews in the Province of South Carolina Vintner and Groting — Know Ye That I the said Edward Hussey for and in Consideration of the Sum of one hundred and Twenty Pounds Current Money of the Province advanced to me in hand at or before the Sealing and Delivery hereof with and Truly Paid by Joseph Wragg of Charles Town Merchant the Receipt Whereof I do hereby Acknowledge and my self therewith fully Satisfied HAVE bargained and Sold and by these Presents do Grant bargained and Sell unto the said Joseph Wragg one negre Woman Named *to have & to hold* the said Negre Woman with her Increase unto the said Joseph Wragg his Executors Administrators and assigns for ever Provided always nevertheless and upon Condition that of the said Edward Hussey his Executors Administrators at or shall and do Well and Truly Pay or Cause to be Paid unto the aforesaid Joseph Wragg the Sum of one hundred and Twenty Pounds on or before the first day of January next Seventeen hundred and Thirty Two without any Deduction or abatement out of the Same Then these Presents and Every Article and Sentence herein Contained shall be void and be utterly void & of none Effect any thing herein Contained to the Contrary hereof in any wise notwithstanding. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this fourteenth Day of October in the Year Seventeen hundred and Thirty Two and in the Sixth Year of his Majesty's King
