and twenty nine, and in the third year of the reign of
our Sovereign Lord George the Second by the Grace of
God of Great Britain France and Ireland King Defender
of His Fatherland & others Charles Burnham of
the parish of St. Philip's Charleston, in Beaufort County
in the province of South Carolina planter and Executor of
the last will and Testament of his father Charles Burnham
late of Beaufort County aforesaid planter, son of the
One part and David Major, senior of Charleston
aforesaid in the said province of South Carolina Esq' and
John Major of Charleston widow of the other
part. Whereas at the last Court of Common Pleas
held at Charleston aforesaid before Sir Richard Klein
