I further more do appoint M^{rs} Carolina Dawson the sole Guardian of my Daughter Elizabeth Carolina Ball and I do declare and appoint Augustus Theodor Gaillard and William A. Carson and Henry Gouden Executors of this my last will and Testament, dated this twenty sixth day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty four and sealed with my seal
