Horry of the State of South Carolina deceased. Whereas my said late  
husband by his last Will and Testament dated the seventeenth day of April  
1825, did give and bequeath to his Mother and to me, to each of us a half  
of the usufruct, rents produce or avails of all his property real and personal in Ca-  
rolina, consisting among other things in lands and Slaves; and Whereas by his  
said last Will my said Husband hath declared that at the decease of one  
of us, the said legatees, "it was his Will that the survivor shall have the sole  
property of all he possessed in Carolina," as with more fully appear by reference  
to the said Will. Now therefore: First, I give and bequeath all the lands  
meadows or tenements, slaves and other property of every and what kind so-  
ever of which I may die possessed and situate lying and being in the State of  
South Carolina, to Joshua Washington Toomer of Charleston in the State of  
said, Enquire in trust to sell the said lands, meadows and tenements, slaves  
and other property unto one belonging and to pay over the net proceeds



Isaac Cox Barnett Consul of the United States of America for Paris, also in  
Trust for my <sup>husb</sup> at law whom I hereby appoint sole executor of this my last Will  
and Testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me made.

the thirteenth day of March in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight  
hundred and thirty.
