granted bargained sold and delivered
and by these presents in plain and open
Market according to the use formerly had by
De Grant beginning sell and deliver unto
the said William Hazard one Negro Man and
wife & child & I hold the said bargained
provision unto the only person or persons
before of him the said William
Hazard his Executors Administrators &
assignee forever And if the said Elizabeth
Hazard for my Setting my heirs Executors and
Administrators the said bargained provision unto the
said W^r Hazard his Executors Administrators & assignees
at all and all manner of persons shall and will
arrant & forever defend by these presents by
itself Whereof together with the delivery of the
said bargained provision I have hereunto set my
hand and seal this first day of June in the
fifth year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord
George the Second by the Grace of God of Great
Britaine France & Ireland King Defender

Discharge of a mortgage by Wm Osborne to George 273

Carolina Barnfield

To all People to whom these presents shall come
it may Come William Osborne of Charles Town in the
Province of Maryland Mariner late living Whereas
George Barnfield of the same place Esq' hath been a Custom
Deed Notary bearing equal date herewith for the Considera-
tion herein mentioned doth hereby Bargain and sold
unto me a certain Portraiture named named The George,
together with all and singular his Rigging furniture
and apparel as here in particularly described
to be the said Deed Notary being the same had
many fitter appear Now know ye that the
said William Osborne Do hereby acknowledge
and agree that the said note poll or Bill of Sale was so
made unto him by George Barnfield to have and to enjoy
the same upon trust and for the sale and only pur-
pose to be of benefit and advantage of the said
George Barnfield and of his Sons and Executors and that he
shall have the said Portraiture together with all her Rigging Furniture
and apparel, Land and the like and only proper
goods & chattels of the said George Barnfield his
Sack and armisture are the said William
Osborne Do hereby for my self my Heirs and executors
covenant promise and agree to bind with the
said George Barnfield his executors and administrators
That the said William Osborne shall not suffer to
be done any act or thing whatsoever whereby
or by means whereof the said Portraiture or any of his
said her tenantry shall or may be lawfully Charged
