Fourthly. It is my Will and I hereby direct, that my said Executors do pay
unto my God Daughter, Margaret Vause, the sum of Fifty dollars which I
give her as a memento of my good Will towards her. Fifthly, I hereby give
and devise to my young friends John & Peter all and ^{heron} part and parcel of
my estate both real and personal of which I may die seized and possessed after
paying the bequests above ~~named~~ made. This latter devise being made on
the account of the many acts of kindness done me by his deceased Father as
well as my love for the said John & Peter. Sixthly, I hereby give full
power and authority to my Executors hereinafter named, to sell all and
every part of my estate should they so wish it, and it be most to the interest
of those concerned herein. Lastly, I hereby nominate ~~as~~ ^{to}

unto my God Daughter, Margaret Vause, the sum of Fifty Dollars which I
give her as a memento of my good Will towards her. Fifthly, I hereby give
and devise to my young friend John H. Peter all and, ^{very} part and parcel of
my estate both real and personal of which I may die seized and possessed after
paying the bequests above ~~named~~ made. This latter devise being made on
the account of the many acts of kindness done me by his deceased Father as
well as my love for the said John H. ~~Peter~~ Sixthly, I hereby give full
power and authority to my Executors hereinafter named, to sell all and
every part of my estate should they so wish it, and it be most to the interest
of those concerned herein. Lastly, I hereby nominate constitute and appoint
my friends Bishop England and John H. Peter Executors of this my last
Will and Testament, hoping that after my death no disagreements shall
