and making void, all former Wills, by me at any time heretofore made - and as to
such worldly Estate, whereunto it has pleased God to intrust me, I dispose of the
same as follows - I hereby give and bequeath unto my beloved niece and
god daughter Harriet Emma Motte, her executors, administrators, and assigns,
four my negroes, Jack, Phoebe, Mary and her children, Alexander Little
Phoebe and Ann with their future issue and increase - I then, I give and

bequeath to my said Niece Harriet Emma Motte, her Executors, Administrators, and assigns forever, Eighty one (81) shares in the Union Bank of South Carolina Three (3) shares in the Bank of South Carolina, Fifty two (52) shares in the Planters Merchants Bank of South Carolina, also my Watch, all my silver, all my house furniture, and whatever else the house contains of mine. Item, I give and Devise to Mr. Joshua Ward Motte, and his heirs forever, all and singular my undivided moiety and half part of the farm called "Sans Souci", situated on Charleston Neck, East side of Ashley River, in trust presently and to, and for, the sole, and separate use of my sister Mary Ward Motte for and during the term of her natural life, without impeachment of waste, and free from all claims of the Creditors, of her late, or any future husband, whatsoever, and from and immediately after the death, of my said sister Mary Ward Motte, then in trust, to deliver the said moiety of the aforesaid farm, to all and singular the children of my said sister Mary Ward Motte living, at her death to be held by them as Tenants in common, free from all further Trust, and to them their heirs, and assigns, forever, All the rest and residue of my Estate and effects of every kind whatsoever, after paying, my just debts, and funeral expences, I give and bequeath to my said Niece Harriet Emma Motte; her Executors, Administrators and assigns, forever (giving my said niece and god daughter Harriet Emma Motte, my consent to sell out, my stock, and also, she may dispose, of the negroes, or keep them as she may think fit) And lastly, I hereby nominate constitute and appoint my said Niece Harriet Emma Motte, ^{Executrix} and James Albert Hopkins, ^{Executor} of this my last Will and Testament, In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Twentieth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and thirty nine (1839)
