In the Name of God Amen the twenty seventh Day
of August in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred
& fourteen I Geo. Crickton of Berkeley County in the province
of South Carolina planter being very sick & weak in body
but of perfect mind & memory thanks be given unto God
Therefore calling unto mind the mortality of my Body and
knowing that it is appointed for all men once to dye do make
Or dain this my last Will & testament That is to say
Principally I first of all give & recommend my Soul unto the
hands of God who gave it & my Body I recommend to the
Earth to be buried in Decent & Christian manner at the
Discretion of my Exors nothing doubting but at the General
Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the almighty
Power of God & as touching such worldly Estate wherewith
it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give Devise
& dispose of the same in the following manner & form

1st I give & bequeath to Eliz. Crickton my dearly beloved Wife some third
part of all my personal & moveable Estate to her & her heirs forever
2nd I give to my said beloved Wife one Indian boy named
Arche & one Indian Girl named Jane together with all my plate
bearing hers or any of her Relations names as also one bay mare
formerly belonging to herself with all the produce of said
mare & my best riding horse to her & her heirs for ever
3rd I give unto my well beloved Daughter Ann Crickton two
hundred pounds current money of this province to be paid out
of my said Estate by my said Wife on the Day of her marriage
or at the Age of Eighteen w^{ch} shall first happen with one
Negro Boy named Titus & one black mare & full with their
produce to her & her heirs for ever
Item I will & appoint that my said Daughter Ann Crickton be

maintained & educated out of the produce of my said Estate
freely & handsomely as the same will permit untill
be married or that he arrive at the said Age of Eighteen
Years which shall first happen.

Item I give to my well beloved Daughter Eliz. Critton and her
Share of the remaining part of my moveable & personal Estate
with her Brother George Critton the same to be paid & delivered
her at the Day of Marriage or at the Age of one & twenty.
shall first happen the which I give to her & her heirs for

Item I will that all my children by my said Wife Eliz. Critton
be maintained & educated out of the profits of my said Estate
in a decent manner as the same will permit untill they
arrive at the Age of one & twenty or are married which shall first
happen in case they survive to that time.

Item I give unto the Child which my said Wife Eliz. is now bearing
provided it be a Boy one tract of Land on the other side
of the pond next to the Estate of John Percivalles with
an Equal Share with his Bro. George & Sister Eliz. of
