direction of my Executor in their Education until the same shall be  
completed. After which the same to revert to my Nieces Hannah and  
Alice Prioleau. In consequence of the long and faithful and affectionate  
devotion of Sarah Hart to me from the period of my infancy I do hereby charge  
my Estate with the payment of an annuity to her of one hundred dollars  
per Annum as a token of my sincere gratitude and regard. And whereas
